Sue announced that volunteers are needed to interview 4-H members who are entering quilts in the Western Montana Fair on August 8 from 9:00 am to 2:00 pm. UFO coordinator Nancy Terwilliger-Grube presented \$50 gift certificates to the two members who tied for the most UFO quilts completed: Rhonda Maun and Susan Appelt. She then drew a name for a \$25 gift certificate and Rhonda also won that. Congratulations!

Upcoming ETC classes include a July 12 bag-making class taught by Stephanie Minnick. Cost of the one-day class is \$25 and will be held at Atonement Lutheran.

A Spirit Butterfly Quilt trunk show will be our program on November 12. A two-day class for members to sew their own Spirit Butterfly Quilt will be offered November 13 and 14. The cost will be \$45.

Break time allowed members to look at and touch quilts with various battings to understand why the correct batting makes a difference. Treats were delicious!

Following the break, members who participated in the Sustainability Challenge showed their quilts. The variety was amazing! These quilters showed what it means to re-use, make do and use up what's in that stash.
