


# News from the Bookstand

Please consider donating one fabric to each basket, or two fabrics to one basket.



**Note:** It is the quilter's choice to assign their quilt to a category for display in the show. Quilters will indicate their top 3 choices for categories applicable for each quilt and the final decision will be determined by the quilt show committee based on the abundance of quilts in those categories. There is not a "right" or "wrong" category to assign to quilts, but rather a way for viewers to see quilts in groups that is not overwhelming.

	Novice quilters (1st quilt or quilt show entry)
	Paper or foundation pieced (Judy Neimeyer, English paper piecing, other foundation designs)
	Panels (A primary fabric which is the focus of quilt)
	_ Patriotic (Sesquicentennial, Quilts of Valor)
	Period Quilts (Civil War, Aunt Gracie's, Victorian, Depression Era, etc.)
	_ Random block designs (Curved and straight seam construction)
	_ Recycle, Re-use, Re-purpose (Includes scrap quilts)



#### 2025-2026 MISSOULA Quilt Guild UFO Challenge.

As quilters we all have many incomplete projects (UFO) in our sewing rooms. The UFO Challenge is a motivational tool for us to finish them. If you have projects, you aren't sure what to do with after completing, we are sure the Quilts 4 Kids, the Comfort Quilts or Quilts of Valor will be happy to accept your finished projects.

#### **Rules and Regulations**

All UFO's are eligible as long as you have started/ cut into them prior to the starting date of the challenge dates.

Kits are eligible, started or not, as long as you purchased them before the starting date of the challenge dates.

Fill out the UFO form with a brief description of your UFO. There is no limit to the number of UFO's you register- just use another piece of paper. For each finished UFO, your name will be placed in a drawing for a gift certificate.
